Note:

- Tradebe Solvent Recycling (TSR) operates two COMAH sites within the Port of Sunderland, namely Hendon and Oceans terminals. Contingency plans are in place to respond to any hazardous incident, which might take place. In the event of a hazardous incident occurring which has potential to transcend the terminal boundaries, a warning siren (similar to a continuous air raid siren) will be sounded. Should the alarm activate, the following guidance applies to all persons / vessels within the port:
 - Persons should be advised to remain indoors, close all doors and windows and tune into local radio for instructions from the emergency services.
 - Similar advice to be provided to ships' crews, plus the need to close off all port holes and air conditioning plant/fan systems which direct air into accommodation or machinery spaces.
- All persons and vehicles entering/leaving port liable to security search
- Official photographic identification must be carried and produced to security on request
- No fishing within port estate
- Pedestrians must use walkways (where provided) or walk on side of road to face oncoming traffic and wear high visibility clothing during darkness
- Port speed limit – 20 mph (10 mph on swing bridge)
